Namibia Digital Archives (DNA)

The DNA collection or project was a co-operative project between the Utah-Valley University, the National Archives of Namibia and the then Polytechnic of Namibia.

The digital archive provides online public access to rich resources that reflects the diversity and cultural stories of Namibian people and to capture these narratives before they disappear with those who hold them such the elderly people who know many traditions and cultures.
